

In solidarity with G20-prisoner Peike: Come to the hearings of the appeal procedure!

In the summer of 2017 the G20 summit took place in Hamburg. While “our” world leaders, the most powerful and rich people on the planet, came together, we also gathered in Hamburg – to show them that their dominion is unacceptable and that we will continue fighting for a better world. During these days of heavy protests, chaos and police repression, our friend and comrade Peike was arrested, along with many others.

After barely two months in prison, on the 27 August 2017, Peike had his court case, the first of all the arrested anti-G20 activists. The infamous judge Krieten – known for his right-wing bias – sentenced Peike to 2 years and 7 months in prison for allegedly having thrown two bottles, resisting arrest and disturbing the public peace, without there being any coherent evidence.

After five months of imprisonment and repression, Peike's higher appeal began on the 9 February 2018. In the course of this process (12 court sessions have taken place so far) it has become evident that also this judge is not that concerned with objectivity and “justice”. Furthermore, the process seems to have less and less to do with Peike and this particular incident. Despite all the processes that clearly showed their “unlawful” conduct, the state is eager to convict no matter what, to show everyone that they are still in power and will not tolerate rebellion.

Notwithstanding this madness, Peike continues to fight. He knows he is not only fighting for his own freedom, but also for that of all the others who have resisted against the G20 summit.

Until we can fight together with Peike in freedom again, while he is imprisoned we need to show him solidarity. Come to the next court sessions, so we can show Peike he is not alone!
